There has been some extraordinary and absorbing tennis at Wimbledon with plenty of last set comebacks. Cameron Norrie described his quarter final match as bonkers ... And of course England hit 378 in the last innings of a test match at five an over losing only three wickets in the process...

Ben Stokes, England's new test captain, tried to put into words the turn-around that has taken place in the last few weeks with four successful run chases. "A great way to explain it is that

He was also quick to tell us that the £10,000 had been anonymously given for the purpose!

"You asked that your bishop be holy, visionary, transforming, courageous, unifying, visible, caring," he said. "This is my vocation, and this is now our vocation. We can do this; this is our time. You now bear the responsibility for this gift. This is His Kingdom here and now, amen." As one person put it,

"Exciting times ahead."

Let's pray for Bishop Stephen, and the others who been making headlines this week, especially those in leadership, and indeed ourselves, for the bravery and courage they and we need. Joshua was told: "Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go."
