God's plans turned things upside down that day as death was defeated, despair turned to hope and the possibilities of the impossible happening made the future bright.

So as we walk this Easter season as God's people, we can do so with hope in our hearts. Praying earnestly for peace in Ukraine, calling for the just treatment of asylum seekers, seeking wisdom for the climate crisis and waiting expectantly for the arrival of our new Bishop, trusting in the God of surprises, and standing firm in faith when the unexpected happens'.
