Returning to everyday life and daily news, it would be easy to forget this so I wondered how you are spending this time.


Have you been able to build in time for reflection, join one of the study groups or join the Wednesday lunchtime Zoom meetings?

Some of you will be exploring faith in music, through your prayer life or through faith and our environment. Perhaps social justice is something you are passionate about,

so you may be following the political debates on asylum seekers and refugees.

I find exploring my faith and prayer life through something visual helps me reflect. A famous painting that I'm sure many of us know is that of Holman Hunt based on the verse from *Rev 3.20* 'Behold, I stand at the door and knock; if you open the door, I will come to you and eat with you, and you with me.'





In response to that verse *Meister Eckhart* wrote 'You need not seek him here or there; he is no further than the door of your heart; there he stands, patiently awaiting whoever is ready to open up and let him in. No need to call him from afar; he can hardly wait for you to open up. He longs for you a thousand times more than you long for him.'

We all have different ways of responding to God's call through prayer. Whether you enjoy praying with Scripture, praying through the Eucharist, praying for a list of people, whilst walking in the countryside or perhaps by being taken into silence beyond words and images into contemplation, Lent is an opportunity to perhaps explore a different way of praying. Praying outside of our comfort zone can be challenging, but it can also be very liberating.

I read an interesting article recently on what happens when we pray. It was explaining the latest findings from neurotheology. What is clear from this is how habitual practice alters our brains. Singing worship songs and hymns or meditating regularly are all ways by which the brain develops its temporal lobes. We develop these, and in doing so, in collaboration with other parts of our brains, we increase our capacity for spiritual experience.

However you are spending Lent, my prayer for you is that you will enjoy and yet be challenged by the journey, that your faith may deepen, and that you will feel truly blessed.

Revision of the Electoral Roll

The Electoral Roll is a list of members who are entitled to participate in the government of the church and to vote at the Annual Parochial Church Meeting.

If anyone who attends Christ Church, St James', St Nicholas', or St Peter's churches in our benefice who is not already on the roll, and who would like to be added to the 2023 Electoral Roll, please complete an application form. Blank copies are available at the back of some churches and from the church wardens listed in this NewsLink. Once completed, please give them to one of the churchwardens or the clergy. Completed forms should be returned by 4th April, ready for Annual Church Meetings occurring in April.

Who can be on the electoral roll? To be on the electoral roll a person needs to have been baptised, be at least 16 years old and either:

- Living in the parish and a member of the Church of England or a Church in communion with the Church of England
- Not resident in the parish but is a member of the Church of England (or a Church with which the Church of England is in communion) and has regularly attended worship in the parish during the six months prior to enrolment
- A member in good standing of a Church which subscribes to the doctrine of the Holy Trinity and they are prepared to declare themselves a member of the Church of England, having regularly attended worship during the six months prior to enrolment.
