#### Dear friends,

Interregnums are good for a church!

Not everyone will agree with me. There are lots of mutterings about the Diocese and its system of starting the recruitment process after I have left. After all, they knew well in advance that I was retiring. Other mutterings are that it's all about the Diocese saving money, which is partly true, but it's not the whole truth.

Exciting new things can happen during an Interregnum (also called a Vacancy). When one of my previous Rectors retired, there was a gap of about a year and in that time, lots happened. To start with, six groups were set up to run an Alpha course – the introduction to Christianity course.

I went on one of these courses, and it changed my life.

At the end of the course, there is traditionally a combined Alpha supper with family and friends invited, along with a speaker, and I was asked to stand up and speak to a room of 100+ people about my experience of Alpha and encourage the visitors to join future courses.

'Oh no, surely not me' was my response. This of course was not the response of many people in the Bible asked to do things which were out of their comfort zone. Mary, the mother of Jesus said 'yes' and was so blessed to carry to birth God's Son. Her words, now form the Song of Praise 'The Magnificat' which is sung or said every evening at Evening Prayer and they have had a profound impact on millions.

Moses didn't think he was a leader or speaker, but God worked through Moses to bring Israel out of slavery. David was the youngest (and therefore most insignificant) of all his brothers, but God worked through David to defeat a giant and eventually made him a king. Paul used to persecute and have Christians killed before he met Jesus, but he went on to become one of the most highly regarded and prolific writers and church planters in history.

You are all called to be part of God's exciting plan for his Benefice. Exciting things can happen if you are willing to come out of your comfort zone and say 'yes' to what God might be calling you to be part of. You might be thinking that you don't have the knowledge, the skills, or the experience, but the reality is, God doesn't call the equipped; He equips those willing to say 'yes' to his call.

After a momentary wobble, I did say 'yes' and spoke to that room full of people. God gave me the words to say, and I have never looked back.
