

RECTOR VACANCY UPDATE

We are now entering a very important phase of the process to recruit our new Rector.

On Thursday 19th October (after this article was written) the interview panel were due to meet with the Archdeacon to review the application and prepare for the interview. The next stage will be the orientation day on Tuesday 31st October and the interview itself the following day.

The purpose of the orientation day is for the candidate to see all of the four churches, find out about the Benefice and ask questions. The day will include visits to the Rectory, Benefice Office and one of the schools. During the visits, the candidate will be meeting PCC Members, LPAs, LWLs, the Associate Priest and Retired Clergy. Those involved are being contacted about this separately. The interview itself will be chaired by Bishop Andrew with panel members comprising the Archdeacon, Rural Dean and the four Parish Representatives. As has been explained previously, the Parish Representatives form the majority of the interviewing panel. The day will begin at 9.30 with morning prayer in St Nicholas Church, which everyone in the Benefice is invited to attend, to pray in particular for the candidate and the interview panel.

It is very important that we continue to cover this whole process in prayer, particularly over the two days of orientation and interview. Sign-up sheets continue to be available in all of the four churches where we are all asked to commit to praying whilst the orientation day and interview are proceeding. You do not need to pray for the whole hour that you sign up for, but to offer prayers at some point during that hour.

Let us trust God in faith to lead us to the Rector that He has in mind for us.

Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus.

It is with sadness that we at Christ Church heard that Peggy Carden died on 3rd Oct. in Bridport, where she lived near her family after husband Bob died in 2008.
