Dear Friends,

The earth is the LORD's, and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it.

Psalm 24:1

Richard and I have just returned from a wonderful holiday in Italy. We decided to travel by train and greatly enjoyed the adventure of hurtling through the varied landscape – mountains, lakes, fields, villages and cities. Unlike flying, one can more fully notice the details of shifting terrains.



We saw broad open flat fields recently harvested in France, ingeniously terraced vineyards on the lower slopes of the Alps, apple orchards in the verdant valleys, high grazing pastureland for livestock and beautifully tended allotments. It made us realise how wonderfully varied creation is and how resourceful human beings are in finding methods to farm/garden according to their locality. The earth is naturally fruitful, yet also so fragile.

The recent news of earthquakes in Morocco and floods in Libya remind us powerfully of the fault lines in the earth and the lack of care we humans have shown to the world, leading to the serious challenges of climate change, which threatens our world, especially the poorest.

As we sped through tunnels and across borders we reflected on how easy it is to hurtle through life - the seasons coming and going, food shopped for each week, meals prepared and eaten, bins emptied. We barely give a thought to the wider landscape of how food is produced, transported, issues of food poverty, politics of land use, the impact of human failures in the care of creation.

Thankfully these issues are coming more to the fore, but there is still so much more we can do. The issues are very urgent. As people of Christian faith we have three foundational mandates God calls us to live by:

To live as good stewards of the good earth.

To be deeply thankful for the gifts God has given us in creation

To work for a more fair and just world, loving our neighbour as ourselves.

STEWARDSHIP THANKFULNESS JUSTICE

Those three mandates are central to the heart of our Church Harvest celebrations. There are many ways we can creatively allow these foundational calls on our lives to make a difference.

There is a super Radio 4 series called *Just one thing*, which focuses each week on small things we can do to make a difference to health and well-being. Here are my simple suggestions for *'Just one thing'* we could do to live more in line with Biblical truths about God's creation.

Stewardship - Reduce waste, use leftovers creatively.

Thankfulness – Say grace at mealtimes more regularly.

Justice – Read a book, watch a programme/listen to a podcast which opens our eyes to a more global perspective on the impact of climate change. Make a practical response.


