During the pandemic I was recommended a book by one of my clergy colleagues. I bought a copy for my daughter for Christ-

mas and was delighted when a film was made of it and it was shown on television.



The book was *The Boy, the Mole, the Fox and the Horse.* The characters create an unexpected friendship and travel together in the boy's search for home. It is a story of kindness, friendship, courage and hope for viewers of all ages, in a heart-warming hand-drawn animated film based on the children's book by Charlie Mackesy.

I overheard a conversation the other day where one young woman talking to another about a situation said, 'He wasn't kind'. Not, 'He put me down', 'He was really awful, or rude to me', but 'He wasn't kind'.



It reminded me of our spiritual lives and the Fruits of the Spirit listed in Galatians. "The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control..." Those who are in Christ have been gifted with the Holy Spirit, enabling them to bear fruit.

Galatians 5: 22 - 23a

We may not always be faithful, have self-control or have love for others. But I wonder if we can always practise kindness. We can be kind to ourselves, but kindness often means putting other people's needs before our own. Even then though, research evidence shows that helping others can also benefit our own mental health and wellbeing.

How might we bear fruit for Christ and practise simple acts of kindness every day?
