Modern Day Slavery - how can you help?

If you found Diana Deal's item on the 'Women in the Shadows' lent course in the last Newslink interesting, you may wish to hear more about this topic and another course which we may run in the Autumn called 'Hidden Voices'.

The Clewer Initiative which developed these courses, enables Church of England dioceses and wider church networks to raise awareness of modern slavery, identify victims and to help provide victim support and care.

Caroline Virgo, the Director of the Clewer Initiative, has agreed to speak to those of us who are interested on **May 11th, 7.30—8.30pm**, via zoom. She will explain more about the 'Hidden Voices' course, which they run over four weeks for individual churches, or a Benefice. This is an excellent chance to hear more about the Clewer Initiative and how we can help tackle modern slavery.
