

Since government lifted some restrictions on 4 July, we have had some experience of services in church during these different times. Two weddings, one funeral, 4 Year 6 school leavers services, a Sunday Holy Communion Service, with another planned.

Let's do all we can to support the appeals that are being set up and pray for the medical staff, the aid workers and the volunteers who will be helping the wounded, the hungry and the homeless. We live in a beautiful part of England, blessed by God with peace and freedom. Let's do all we can to bless others in return.

Many of you may have seen on the news about the massive explosion in Beirut a few hours ago. We have received many messages from folk asking if we are all right and we are grateful for your concern. We are pleased to be able to say that we are fine. We live some miles from the area and were outside when the explosion happened - it was a tremendous blast. From what we see on the local TV there is massive devastation and clearly many are killed or injured. Hospitals are overwhelmed.

We have heard from all of our CMS friends in Lebanon and they are all well too. However, we are concerned about some of our colleagues from LSESD who lived close to the explosion. We do know some of their homes have been badly damaged and we believe some may be injured. Although the cause is still not known there is much speculation and this is a tense time for many reasons.

Please pray for those who are injured, for the emergency services and for a sense of calm among the chaos. Thank you all for your concern for us.

Virtual Space for Prayer

As a Diocese our vision of Renewing Hope encourages us to pray, serve and grow together and so we welcome the launch of a new website to help people pray – maybe for the first time.



HOPE Spaces was launched at the start of 2020, inviting churches to use a public place as a space for the spiritually curious to explore prayer. Then the world went into lockdown. Undeterred, HOPE Together has developed a virtual HOPE Space at <u>www.hopespaces.com</u>.

Dr Rachel Jordan-Wolf, who inspired the project said:

"As lockdown began and research showed that many non-Christians were exploring prayer, we looked online and found that most websites about prayer were for practising Christians. So we began to develop a virtual HOPE Space online, where people can post their prayers and explore ways to engage with God in prayer."

www.hopespaces.com is a multimedia, interactive site for anyone who wants to try praying, the spiritually curious and anyone looking for hope. It includes a specially-made film to help people call out to God and a virtual HOPE prayer wall where anyone can post a prayer. There's also a meditation on rest to watch, plus content to help visitors think about their life's direction and pray for justice or peace.

Where churches are able to create a physical HOPE Space in a church building, an empty

and downloads for six different prayer stations available on the HOPE Spaces web page, developed in partnership with 24-7 Prayer. <u>www.hopespaces.com</u> can also be displayed as part of a physical HOPE Space.

"We hope that Christians will use social media to invite their friends, colleagues, and neighbours to explore prayer at <u>www.hopespaces.com</u> and we hope churches will add a link from their website to this new resource" says Rachel.

www.hopespaces.com is part of a larger HOPE Together initiative at www.hopeforall.org.ukwhere the spiritually curious can also read stories and watch videos about people who have found hope through faith in Jesus.

From the Bible Society prayer diary - Daphne Cox.

Dear colleagues and friends this is how Prasad, a migrant worker in Dubai, explained the current situation: "It is not Corona but Karuna which means mercy, grace and compassion in Telugu. "God is giving us the opportunity to return to him. It is God's wake-up call to us to wake up and pursue the reality of God." In the Bible society in the Gulf they are responsible for working with the United Arab emirates, Kuwait, Bahrain, Saudi Arabia, Qatar, Oman and Yemen. Pray for their ministry among migrant workers and their mission to publish and distribute bibles in 60 languages. They certainly need a prayers, with this colossal task to deal with, and spread the gospel of Jesus Christ.

Each fortnight we will also publish your photos, bible verses that have spoken to you, reflections and poems in News Link or on the website.


